



The Ascension of Our Lord



Introduction to the Day

In today's gospel the risen Christ ascends into heaven and his followers are assured that the Spirit will empower them to be witnesses throughout the earth. The disciples were told to not gaze up into heaven to look for Jesus; we find his presence among us as we proclaim the word and share the Easter feast. We too long for the Spirit to enliven our faith and invigorate our mission.

Easter Celebration

The joy of Easter continues. Our environment, still filled with flowers, fabric and fragrance, urges us to "keep the feast," to sustain our joy and wonder at God's great gift to us in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

As a physical reminder of our continuing celebration of our Lord's Resurrection, we will **stand** for all the portions of the Service at which we would normally kneel during the Fifty Days of the Easter Season as a reminder that, because we have knelt in the shadow of the Cross and have been forgiven our sins by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we can now stand before the throne of grace as God's dear children. After the Day of Pentecost we shall return to our normal practice of kneeling during the Service.

Feast of Ascension



This morning we observe the Day of the **Ascension**, marking Christ's return to heaven and his promise to send the Spirit to embolden his disciples to make disciples of all nations. During the service, the flame on the Paschal candle, which has burned in the chancel since the Day of the Resurrection, disappears into the cloud as our Lord takes his leave from those whom he left to carry out his work.

The Reverend Michelle Sevig (Holy Trinity Lutheran Church) will be the preaching minister.

May 23 – The Day of Pentecost

Next **Sunday, May 23**, the Day of Pentecost, Saint Luke will celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit to the church. Become part of the festival environment by wearing your **red** shirt, sweater, dress or coat.
