Easter Celebration



The joy of Easter continues. Our environment, still filled with flowers, fabric and fragrance, urges us to "keep the feast," to sustain our joy and wonder at God's great gift to us in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

During the Fifty Days of the Easter Season, we will **stand** for all the portions of the Service at which we would normally kneel. We do this as a reminder that because we have knelt in the shadow of the Cross and have been forgiven our sins by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we can now **stand** before God as His children.

Introduction to the Day

This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us in the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding that we read of in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table.
