#### ABOUT THE ILLUSTRATION:

"The Unjust Judge and the Importunate Widow" that appears on the first page of this bulletin is from "The Parables of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ" by Sir John Everett Millais and is an imperfect illustration of the parable in today's gospel in which a persistent widow unrelentingly demands justice from an unjust judge who does not "fear God" or respect other human beings. The judge refuses the widow's repeated petitions but eventually grants her justice so she will not "wear him out."

The woman is placed in the position of a supplicant. Her hands are clasped, pleading, perhaps in a last ditch effort to be heard. The judge's right hand pushes the woman away, and his left hand is upraised — in effect telling her to stop, that he has heard enough and that his answer is still "no."

Still the woman is so persistent that one of the guards has to use both hands to haul her away. However, as we shall see, there is much more to this parable than is depicted in this painting.


