Following the service an usher will dismiss you from your seat. Please exit immediately. Pastor will greet people in the courtyard, weather permitting.


Free parking is available in the parking garage behind the church. Enter from Melrose St. (one block north of Belmont).


Let us pray.





Proclaiming Christ in this Place

The first church building was built in 1884 and dedicated on October 5, 1884. In 1888, the transepts and the apse were added to the old church. Following a disastrous fire which destroyed much of the old structure, the church was rededicated in November of 1899

A new church office and classroom building were built and dedicated between the old church and school in 1949.

In 1960, the old church of Saint Luke was replaced on the same site by the present structure. On October 1, 1960, the new church was dedicated to the Glory of God and the service of humankind.

The Anniversary of Church Dedication

This morning the church is decked in red. This vibrant color recalls the birth of the church in the fire of Pentecost and marks the days on which we celebrate the work of the Holy Spirit in the history of the church. This morning we celebrate the dedication anniversary of both the first church building and our current church building, giving thanks to God for this blessing and the opportunity it affords to serve our children and our community.

Giving to Saint Luke

Here are some easy ways to make donations to Saint Luke:

- Go to <u>stlukechicago.org</u> and click on "**Donate**". The **Online** button will take you to the donation page. You can direct your money to the category you choose, such as: congregation, missions, building or special events. You can also choose the frequency of your donation.
- 2. **Paper form sign-up:** Sign up with **SimplyGiving** (through Vanco)-- an easy and secure way to donate automatically. A form for your use includes a number of options from which to choose: credit/debit card, checking or savings account. It's as easy as getting a form from the church office and returning it to the church. You can also call 773.472.3383 and a form will be sent to you.
- 3. Send a **Text Message** to **833.988.0613** with the amount you would like to contribute (example: 25). Within a few minutes, you will be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and debit or card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt of your donation via email.
 - For future giving, send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically! You can even text "repeat" to make it a recurring donation. Text giving is one of the fastest and easiest ways to give.
- 4. Remember, as always, you can make your donation through **offering envelopes**, in the **offering basket**, or by using the giving **kiosk** in the Church Lobby.
