



Sundays after Pentecost – Lectionary 28

This morning the church is decked in red. This vibrant color recalls the birth of the church in the fire of Pentecost and marks the days on which we celebrate the work of the Holy Spirit in the history of the church. For Saint Luke Church, October is a month of “red celebrations,” our “red letter month”. On Sunday, October 17 we will celebrate the day of Saint Luke and on Sunday, October 31 the anniversary of the Reformation.

Introduction to the Day

The rich man who comes to ask Jesus what he should do to inherit eternal life is a good man, sincere in his asking Mark’s gospel is along in saying that Jesus looked on him and loved him. Out of love not as judgment, Jesus offers him an open door to life: sell all you own and give it to the poor. Our culture bombards us with the message that we will find life by consuming. Our assemblies counter this message with the invitation to find life by divesting for the sake of the other.

October 17 – Saint Luke Day

On Sunday, October 17, the congregation will mark the *Day of Saint Luke*. Saint Luke was an evangelist, the writer of the Gospel that bears his name and a physician. Members and friends are asked to submit the names of their health care providers, caregivers and those individuals who follow in the footsteps of our patron saint to be remembered by name in the prayers at the 9:30 a.m. service on that day.

October 31 - Reformation

On October 31 the congregation celebrates the anniversary of the beginning of the movement that would result in the Reformation of the Church.
