

The presiding minister continues to thank and praise God, remembering especially the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and his promise and command to celebrate this meal.


For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

as we forgive those who sin against us.


Save us from the time of trial

Out Into The World

When we are filled with the breath of God, and we allow God to inspired us to action, we can – like bubbles – move together in beauty and in joy and in light, in response to God's direction through the Spirit.

Bubbles move around in response to air currents and they help us to "see" something invisible - like the wind mentioned in Acts 2. But what bubbles demonstrate, so beautifully, is not only the gentle tug of the move of the Spirit, but the way the Spirit sparks joy, and how joy, and beauty, and love can multiply and move around the community.

Today, as we stand on the Greenview Plaza we send bubbles into the air and experience the joy and beauty and love of Pentecost. You will also receive a red bow to take home and tie on your doorknob to remind you that each time you leave your home, you take Christ out into the world with you.

Easter Season

The joy of Easter continues. Our environment urges us to "keep the feast," to sustain our joy and wonder at God's great gift to us in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

As a physical reminder of our continuing celebration of our Lord's Resurrection, we will **stand** for all the portions of the Service at which we would normally kneel during the Fifty Days of the Easter Season as a reminder that, because we have knelt in the shadow of the Cross and have been forgiven our sins by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we can now stand before the throne of grace as God's dear children. After the Day of Pentecost we shall return to our normal practice of kneeling during the Service.

Introduction to the Day

On the fiftieth day of Easter we celebrate the Spirit, through whom and in whom the people of God are created and re-created. Pentecost is sometimes called the church's birthday, but might more appropriately be called its baptism day, since the gift of the Spirit is the fullness of baptism. Ezekiel's vision shows the Spirit resurrecting and re-creating not just individuals but the whole people. Romans makes it clear that God is in the process of re-creating the entire cosmos; yet the Spirit is also at work in the most intimate and personal way, praying in us with sighs too deep for words" when we do not know how to pray.
