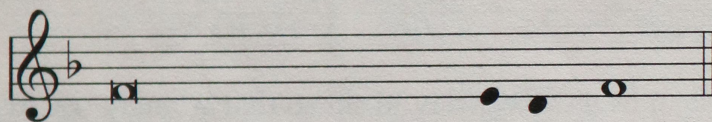
## *Vespers*

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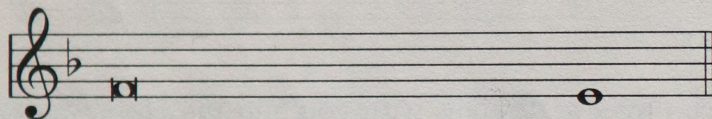
*A simplified form of Evening Prayer, suitable for family or small group devotion, is indicated by the small circle.*
