All baptized Christians are welcome at the Lord's table. We all need what only Christ can give.


For your convenience, there are *large print copies* of the Sunday bulletin and *individual sound enhancement devices*.

Sit BLESSING OF ANIMALS


The animals of God's creation inhabit the skies, the earth, and the sea. They share in the fortunes of human existence and have a part in human life. God, who confers his gifts on all living things, has often used the service of animals or made them symbolic reminders of the gifts of salvation.

Animals were saved from the flood and afterwards made a part of the covenant with Noah. The paschal lamb brings to mind the Passover sacrifice and the deliverance from the bondage of Egypt; a giant fish saved Jonah; ravens brought bread to Elijah; animals were included in the repentance enjoined on humans. And animals share in Christ's redemption of all of God's creation.

We therefore invoke the divine blessing on these animals. As we do so, let us praise the Creator and thank God for setting us over other creatures of the earth. Let us also ask God that, remembering our human dignity, we may walk always in God's law.

May God bless us and all pets and companion animals in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Sundays after Pentecost – Pet Blessing

This morning we mark the Day of St. Francis with a rite for the blessing of companion animals. St. Francis is the patron saint of animals. As we honor his memory through the animals that enrich our lives, we give thanks to God for the blessings of all creation and pray that we may be good stewards of the created realm with which God has entrusted us.

The color green in the worship environment and the colors on the altar indicate our participation in the Church's "season of growth." Each week this "growing section" expands, its colors mirroring the greens of the season. As the strips spread over the altar, they will form a cross that will ultimately enfold the entire space and include every color of the growing season. We, the baptized congregation, are like these diverse strips. Together we form the Body of Christ—one body composed of many diverse members.

Introduction to the Day

Consideration of and care for those in need (especially those "at our gate," visible to us, of whom we are aware) is an essential component of good stewardship. It is in the sharing of wealth that we avoid the snare of wealth. It is the one whom death could not hold—who comes to us risen from the dead—who can free us from the death grip of greed.




October 30 - Reformation
