



Christmas Eucharist Instructions

We would like to celebrate the **Eucharist together on Christmas Day**. We have been having several conversations about this, especially at the coffee hours on Sunday. What I am proposing has come out of those conversations and represents the wisdom of our conversations and my best instincts as a pastor. Even though some of us have been able to receive the eucharist in person, most of us have been fasting from the sacrament since last March. Remembering that the Reformation was primarily a pastoral care movement to restore access to the Gospel to the people, in time of ongoing pandemic, I would like to offer the Holy Eucharist to all of our members, wherever you are worshipping. We can do this in two ways, and you are welcome to partake in either of them.

Some have indicated that they would be most comfortable receiving a consecrated host and then partaking of the Body of Christ at the appropriate time in the liturgy. I will consecrate these hosts this coming Sunday at our Advent 4 liturgy at 9am. This will be a zoom gathering and we will all be together, see one another, pray together. The consecrated hosts from the liturgy will be distributed during the week for your reception when we gather for the Christ Mass on Christmas Day in a zoom liturgy. We have volunteers eager to deliver the consecrated hosts to your home.

Please reserve your communion hosts by calling the church office 773.472.3383 or emailing the office (estampfl@stlukechicago.org), and sharing your contact information.

This is the usual practice of sharing the eucharist for those who are not able to be at the assembly.

We are also offering the opportunity to receive the eucharist together through virtual consecration. You can place bread (we will share the recipe Jean Linsner uses to make the bread we use on Sundays-or you can use any bread you have) and wine on your table. When I take bread and wine at the altar and speak the words of institution you may lift up your bread and wine at home-or your consecrated host. We will all speak together the words of invitation: "The body of Christ for you-The blood of Christ for you" and be reminded that we are receiving this precious gift of life in the midst of the assembly, not just communing ourselves.

I want to invite you to join in this virtual communion, but also to refrain if you are not comfortable with this. I will also speak a blessing for those who do not receive: "May the presence of Jesus be with you always."

I am inviting us to trust the Holy Spirit. God has left us with these sacraments of earthly elements of water, bread, wine, because God wants to be with us, touch us, work faith in us by the Holy Spirit. Virtual communion will not be our new normal. On Feast days such as Christmas Day, Epiphany, and Saint Luke anniversary on January 24 we will share in this holy meal.

It is our hope and prayer that we can return to in-person worship on our anniversary day. We will worship at our traditional 8:30 and 10:30 times, with the Voter's meeting at 9:30 between the services. And we want to make the consecrated host available to everyone each time we celebrate the eucharist when we return to in-person worship.

Communion Bread Recipe

This recipe takes approximately 30 minutes from start to finish and makes four round loaves (6-7 inches in diameter) and a priest host.

Preheat oven to 350°

Ingredients

1 1/2 cups whole wheat flour
1/2 cup white flour
3/4 teaspoon baking soda
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 heaping teaspoons vegetable oil (yes, that's the direction!)
3 tablespoons honey or molasses, or combo (I use 2T molasses & 1T honey)
3/4 cups cold water

Tools

Mixing bowl	Measuring cups
Measuring spoons	Wooden spoon
Pizza cutter	Rolling pin
Baking pan	

Directions

Mix

1. Measure dry ingredients into mixing bowl and stir to combine.
2. Measure water, oil, and honey/molasses. Mix together.
3. Bring wet & dry ingredients together. It will look very rough.

Knead

4. Turn out mixture onto lightly floured board and knead about 1/2 minute until it comes together. The rough mixture will transform into a smooth, uniformly colored ball of dough. Add a bit of flour if the dough feels too sticky

Form

5. Cut dough ball into 4 equal pieces.
6. If making Priest Host: Pinch off a small marble-sized knob of dough from each of the 4 pieces; combine to form one larger ball and roll out to about a 2-3 inch round. Set aside. (I do this because I like the idea that the

priest host is formed from the loaves that will be fed to the congregation.)

7. On a lightly floured surface, roll out one of the 4 balls of dough into a round approximately 6-7 inches in diameter and no more than 1/3 inch thick
8. Transfer the round to the baking pan. Continue to roll out remaining three dough balls and transfer to pan.

Score

9. Using the pizza cutter, score the dough rounds, creating a grid pattern. Each "square" should be about 1/2 an inch. Don't be afraid to cut down to the baking pan when you are scoring the dough.
10. Place the priest host among the 4 scored rounds.

Bake

11. Bake the communion bread at 350° for about 9-10 minutes.
12. Cool completely. Use that morning or wrap well and freeze

Notes:

1. I use King Arthur whole wheat flour. It seems to work best.
2. After measuring the oil, drip a couple of drops of oil onto the honey/molasses measuring spoon to ensure a complete release of the honey/molasses.
3. Weather impacts how the dough behaves, so some days, you will find yourself adding more flour during the kneading/rolling phase.
4. Scoring the dough makes dividing of the bread for distribution much easier and neater.
The squares will be less likely to fall apart before you want them to, if you allow the bread to cool for a couple of minutes on the baking pan before transferring to a cooling rack.

Call Committee

Saint Luke Ministries is engaged in the work of calling a new pastor. A call committee is being created as part of this process. The call committee receives candidates recommended by the Synodical Bishop. The call committee will evaluate and recommend the candidate it believes God desires this congregation to have as its pastor. After this recommendation is made, the Ministry Board will call a special meeting of the Voter's Assembly. The call to the new pastor can only be made by the Voter's Assembly.

The congregation will have opportunities to meet the recommended candidate before the meeting of the Voter's Assembly.

Serving on the call committee will require a significant commitment of time, both for meetings and for prayerful discernment. If you would like to serve on the call committee, please complete the form below. You will be contacted by the nominating committee (Betsy Wassilak, Paul Heltne, Mark Godecke, and David Nelson). Positions on the call committee are limited, and we will strive to create a committee that represents the entire congregation. We greatly appreciate the desire to serve expressed by all applicants. The names of the call committee members will be announced at the congregational meeting on January 24, 2021.
