


## EVENING PRAYER

## Vespers


A simplified form of Evening Prayer, suitable for family or small group devotion, is indicated by the small circle.























# 2. As the hymn is sung, the candles on and near the altar are lighted. When the large candle is used, the candles are lighted from its flame.





















## 3. The thanksgiving concludes the Service of Light.


11. The LITANY is sung or said. The complete Litany may be sung to the alternate musical form.













## Silence for meditation



Rejoicing in the fellowship of all the saints, let us commend ourselves, one another, and our whole life to Christ, our Lord.



LO God, from whom come all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works: Give to us, your servants, that peace which the world cannot give, that our hearts may be set to obey your commandments; and also that we, being defended from the fear of our enemies, may live in peace and quietness; through the merits of Jesus Christ our Savior, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God forever. Give us today our daily bread.


Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.

Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.


For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen






