Introduction to the Day

Forerunners and messengers advance the advent of our God. While John the Baptizer's voice in the wilderness may be the principal focus of the day. Malachi's prophesy could as easily herald the coming Lord Jesus as forerunner of the Lord of hosts. Finally all the baptized are called to participate in the sharing of the gospel. In so doing we prepare the way for the coming of the Lord and assist all flesh in capturing a vision of the "salvation of God."

Today

The second week of Advent—we see the signs and prepare for the Messiah! Two of the four candles in the Advent wreath are lighted to mark the progress of the season. The lessons and hymns for the day call for active preparation. We work to make our hearts ready and thus prepare the way for the One who will come to us at Christmas as our Savior.

During the season of Advent an important part of our liturgy is omitted. "*Glory to God in the Highest*," the great hymn of praise usually sung at the beginning of the service, was the proclamation of the Christmas angels who announced the Savior's birth to shepherds. As we prepare for the coming of the Savior, we remember that earth has not yet seen the angels or heard their song. This hymn will be restored to our service on Christmas Eve when we of earth will join heaven's angels in announcing the birth of the Savior.

The Altar



Looking toward the altar, the focus of attention in the chancel, we see on the frontal an unusual but fitting metaphor for our season. The hurricanes that inspired this image elicit the type of responses that should mark our Advent vigil. As a storm approaches, watchers acknowledge its power and track its passage, proclaiming to all the latest news. All those in the storm's path actively prepare for its coming. And as it approaches with awesome might and terrible power, all eyes are fixed on its progress. So are our eyes fixed on the coming King in our observance of Advent. We are ready! We are prepared! We watch and wait!

Arising from the wind and the power of the central eye of this symbol are Hebrew letters in white – Psalm 80:2, a prayer of God's ancient people, their fervent cry for deliverance: "*Stir up your power and come to save us.*" The cry from the midst of distress links us through time and space to those who first heard the words of God's promise. This phrase is repeated in prayers throughout the season, an expression of our hope in the fulfillment of our longing.



You will notice that the bales of hay forming the manger for Jesus in the stable are in the chancel. We are using the components of the manger scene as part of the Advent worship and preparation for the children of the Academy and Sunday School. The first week is the stable, the next week the animals, the following week the shepherds and holy family, and the final week of Advent, the Baby. Like lighting one, then two, then three, then four Advent candles, we build anticipation as we build the space for the birth of Jesus.


