




Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.



Worship Space

During the season of Lent, changes in the liturgy serve to emphasize the reflective and penitential nature of this season:

The joyous Hymn of Praise (Glory to God) is omitted. The Alleluia is absent. It was "buried" on Shrove Tuesday and will not be sung until the announcement of the resurrection at the Easter Vigil when we again shout that ancient and joyful acclamation.

Lighted candles will not be used in processions until the Light of the World returns to life on Easter.

Finally, our penitence and discipline are highlighted in an expanded Eucharistic prayer in which we pay special attention to the gifts God gives us in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.



Introduction to the Day

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The ten commandments are one of the chief parts of Luther's catechism, a core piece of baptismal instruction. They begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit—making can become our gods.


